Additional comparison information: In the Russian Federation holders of the Specialist Diploma in General Medicine/Dentistry may join the labour market as a highly skilled professional in the area of medicine once they have completed either a one-year internship (интернатура/internatura) or two-year residency (ординатура/ordinatura) in a specialisation of their choice within a clinical setting. Once this is complete, they are granted a licence to practise from the Ministry of Health. Holders of the Specialist Diploma may also gain access to doctoral programmes.

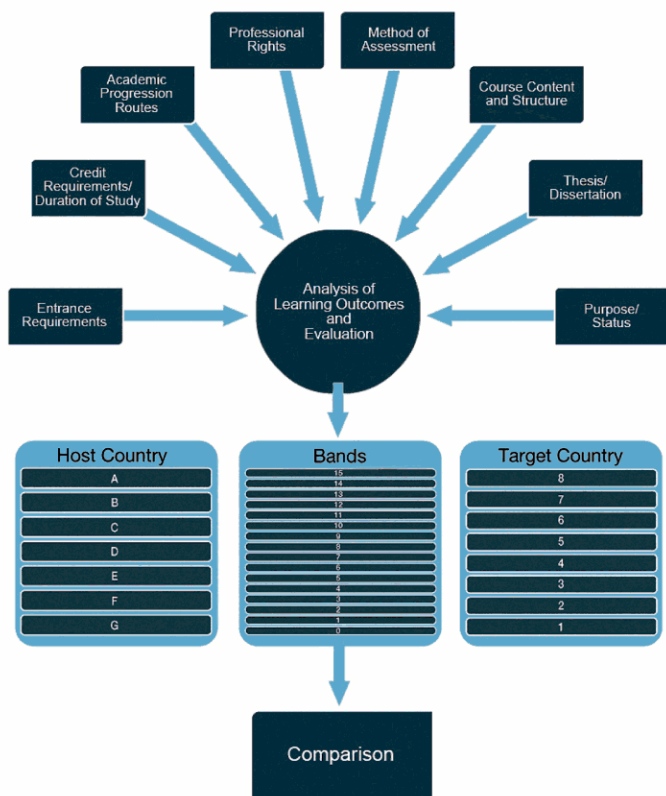

How qualifications are evaluated and compared



The United Kingdom is a signatory to the Convention on the Recognition of Qualifications concerning Higher Education in the European Region, 1997; UK ENIC is the UK's national qualification information centre. The Convention sets out the broad guidelines by which international qualifications are recognised in a signatory country.

UK ENIC has further developed its evaluation system, so that the Statement of Comparability can fully reflect the range and type of qualifications received from across the world.

The UK ENIC Band Framework® allows for a formal qualification at any level of any education system to be mapped across to a comparable level within the education systems and frameworks operating across the UK. This process is guided by the principles of the Convention; it is objective, fair, and rigorous.

The above diagram gives an overview of UK ENIC's evaluation process. There are 16 hierarchical, learning outcome-based Bands, which are independent of the nominal distinctions between secondary, undergraduate and postgraduate cycles of study. Significant differences exist between national education systems, so it is not, for instance, automatically the case that a Bachelor degree in one country will compare directly to a Bachelor degree in the UK.

This analysis is separate from any consideration of the grades or marks achieved by an individual. A higher grade in an examination assessing a lower level learning outcome does not necessarily mean a higher level outcome is being achieved. To give a full picture to an employer or institution, you should present a range of evidence, including your transcripts that show your marks and grades, module-by-module.

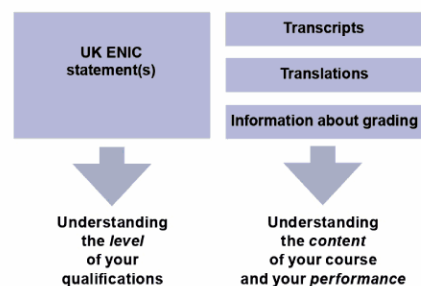
Showcase your skills
